NOTE ON MEETING WITH HONORABLE GOVERNOR OF NAGALAND RELATED TO LANDSLIDE STUDY

As per the request from Hon'ble Governor of Nagaland to Deputy Director General, State Unit: Manipur and Nagaland, a preliminary study was carried out for Old Kohima Municipal Corporation Dumping site Landslide. It is a reoccurring type landslide that has affected 1 km length of NH-29. The study was carried out by Shri. Ramen Das, Geologist, Shri. Puloketo K. Achumi, Geologist, Shri. T. Longchari, Sr. Geologist, Shri. K. Banerjee Suptdg. Geophysicist, Shri. Shyiem, Suptdg. Geophysicist under the supervision of Shri. S. P. Dhanvijay, Director. It covered mapping of the landslide, vertical electrical sounding of the slided zone and geotechnical sample analysis. The preliminary landslide study report was submitted to the Hon'ble Governor on 17th October, 2019.

The Hon'ble Governor invited Geological Survey of India to present the work in a meeting held on 19th October, 2019 at Raj Bhavan. Shri P. V. Ramana Murthy, Deputy Director General, State Unit: Manipur and Nagaland along with Shri Ramen Das, Geologist and Shri. Puloketo K. Achumi represented GSI in the meeting. It was attended by Hon'ble Governor of Nagaland, Managing Director, NHIDCL and other officials from NHIDCL and contractor in charge of Dimapur-Kohima four lane project. A PowerPoint presentation was given by Shri. Ramen Das, Geologist explaining the causes and remedial measures of the investigated landslide.

Hon'ble Governor appreciated the effort of Geological Survey of India for helping the stakeholders to understand the causes of the slide affected area and mitigation within a month's time. He also requested Geological Survey of India to take up more stability study collaborating with NHIDCL. Managing Director, NHIDCL also thanked GSI for their contribution in mitigating landslide area and building a sustainable road.
